### **STUDY 1: BORN AGAIN, BORN TO WIN!**

Memorise this verse by the next study: John 3:16

Study Text: John 3:1-5



Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews and no doubt a very intelligent man, suffered from a problem that is common to many - "SPIRITUAL CONFUSION". He believed in God, but he still felt an empty void - he desired a deeper relationship with God. Nicodemus had heard about Jesus. He had heard of Jesus' teaching, miracles and the many healings taking place. Nicodemus knew that Jesus had the answers to life, so he came to Jesus one night to talk to Him.

Jesus said to him the following words, "Unless one is born again, he cannot see the Kingdom of God".

In this study we are going to discover what it means to be born again and that being born again means being "Born to Win".

#### Why do we need to be born again?

#### Man's problem -:

# God's Solution - We can be born again. Read the following Scriptures: Romans 5:8. God's solution is: All have sinned and sin must be punished. Jesus, the Son of God, died to pay the penalty for man's sin and if anyone asks Jesus for forgiveness, He will forgive them and wash away their sin. ⇒What separates us from God? \_\_\_\_\_ ⇒What will Jesus do if we ask Him to forgive us?\_\_\_\_\_ ⇒When our sin is removed can we have access to God? When good works, good morals, education and religion failed to bridge the gap between God and man, Jesus Christ came and made it possible to reach God. How do we become born again? Man's problem is Sin. God's solution is: Forgiveness through Jesus Christ Man's responsibility is: To believe and receive God's free gift of salvation Many people think they can earn their way into heaven. What does Ephesians 2:8-9 tell us about this? In order to become born again we need to:

Why Christians are called "born again"?
In John 3:5 Jesus says, "Unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the Kingdom of God".

ii. Born of the Spirit - our spirit (our "God consciousness") was dead but now it is born again. Our Spirit is alive.

Memorise this verse by the next study: James 5:16b


Study Text: Philippians 1



- **B.** After reading the above, read the book of Acts and then systematically read through the complete New Testament.
- **C.** Start each book at the beginning and systematically read it chapter by chapter.
- **D.** It is often a good idea to take notes and underline important verses.
- **E.** When you are confident with your Bible reading, you might like to start reading the Old Testament along with your New Testament readings. Genesis, Psalms and Proverbs are good books to begin with.
- **F.** If you have any questions, ask a Christian friend or your Connect Group leader.

The word "baptism" is derived from the Greek word "baptizo" which simply means to "wash or plunge into water". Its original use was not a religious one. For example, a blacksmith, in order to cool an item he had been forging, would plunge it into water. The word used for that was "baptizo" - baptised.

#### 10 PRACTICAL WAYS TO WITNESS

- 1. Let the Holy Spirit lead you to the person you are to witness to. Acts 8:29 and Luke 4:1.
- 2. Be natural with the person you are sharing with as it will help them to relax. Don't try to be over spiritual or push people into salvation. We are called to be witnesses only.
- 3. Remember that you are there to share Jesus don't get caught up in arguments, doctrinal differences, etc. We are called to be witnesses only. Christianity is about people finding Jesus for themselves. It's a relationship not a religion.
- 4. Look alive, smile and let your light shine. Remember Jesus came to bring you life and life more abundantly (John 10:10). Nehemiah 8:10 says that the "joy of the Lord is your strength".
- 5. Don't forget the power of your own testimony it does not have to be "sex, drugs and rock 'n roll" in order to be effective. Your own testimony has power whatever it may be. See Revelation 12:11.
- 6. BE BOLD The Bible says that, "the righteous are as bold as a lion" Proverbs 28:1). "God has not given us a spirit of fear but of love, power and a sound mind" (2 Timothy 1:7).
- 7. Relate to the person where they are at. That does not mean that we need to sink to the level of their sin. It means that we relate to them and their situation the same way Jesus would in love (1 Cor. 9:22).
- 8. Know that God will give you the words to speak and will bring things that you need to say to your remembrance. See Matthew 10:19-20 and John 14:26.
- 9. Finally, be ready to give a defence of your faith to everyone who asks (1 Peter 3:15).
